

Visa requirements Mali

If you are planning a trip to Mali, you will need to apply for an Mali visa. An Mali visa is a permit that allows you to enter and stay in Mali for a specific purpose. You can apply for an Mali visa online or by mail. A Mali tourist visa is a document that allows non Mali citizens to visit Mali for tourism or business purposes for a limited period of time.



Visa processing times for Mali can vary depending on various factors. Generally, it is best to apply well in advance of your trip to avoid any last-minute hiccups. Once issued, the visa's validity can also differ based on the type and regulations at the time of application. Typically, tourist visas might have a shorter validity compared to business visas.

Visitors to Mali must obtain a visa from one of the Malian diplomatic missions unless they come from one of the visa exempt countries

Diplomatic/Service Passports:

Holders of diplomatic and service category passports of Brazil, China, Cuba, Russia and Rwanda do not require a visa for a maximum period of 90 days.

Nationals of any country with a diplomatic and service passports do not require a visa for a maximum period of up to 1 month.

Nationals of China holding passports for public affairs do not require a visa for a maximum stay of 90 days

Visa on arrival

Mali does not issue visas upon arrival. A travel visa must be obtained in advance to avoid unexpected fees and surprises at the border.

e-Visa

If your nationality is not part of the exempted, a visa must be obtained before your arrival in Mali, either online or at closest Malian Embassy.

The Mali Evisa application process time may vary depending on the volume of applications and the specific type of visa you're applying for. Generally, your application takes approximately 3-5 business days to process. However, applying for your Mali Evisa at least two weeks before your intended travel date is recommended to allow for any potential delays.

To apply for a Mali Evisa, you'll need to meet the following requirements:

1. Valid Passport: Your passport must be valid for at least six months from entry into Mali and have at least two blank pages for visa stamps.
2. Digital Passport Photo: A recent, colour passport-sized photograph taken within the past six months with a white background.
3. Travel Itinerary: A detailed travel plan outlining your intended activities and places to visit in Mali.
4. Accommodation Details: Proof of your accommodation arrangements, such as hotel reservations or an invitation letter from a host in Mali.
5. Proof of Financial Means: Evidence that you have sufficient funds to cover your expenses while in Mali, such as recent bank statements or a letter from your employer.

Here are the general steps to apply for a Mali visa via na Embassy:

1. Passport Validity: Your passport must be valid for at least six months beyond your stay.
2. Visa Application Form: Complete the visa application form accurately.
3. Photographs: Provide 02 passport-sized photos that meet the specified requirements, white background.
4. Proof of funds.
5. Application Fee: Pay the applicable fee for your visa type; fees may vary, so check the latest information.
6. Interview: Some applicants may be required to attend an interview at the consulate or embassy
