

# Visa requirements for Tunisia



To enter Tunisia, visitors must hold a passport that is valid for the duration of their stay. Some airlines and border officials may require that the passport be valid for at least six months beyond the date of arrival, so travellers are advised to check this requirement before departure.

## Visa not required

Tunisia allows many nationals to visit for tourism purposes without a visa for varying durations. These countries include:

Tourist visas for Tunisia are typically issued for short stays of up to 90 days, although the exact period of validity and permitted duration of stay depend on nationality and the issuing authority's discretion.

## Visa required

Applications should be submitted through a Tunisian embassy or consulate.

Processing times vary by embassy and season, but applications generally take around 5 to 15 working days.

## How to apply for Tunisia Visa

Once you have determined the type of visa you need, the next step is to collect all the required documents. The documents you need will depend on the type of visa you are applying for, but typically include:

A valid passport with at least six months validity remaining

A completed visa application form

Two recent passport-sized photos

Proof of travel arrangements, such as a flight itinerary or hotel reservation statements or a letter from your employer

Proof of travel medical insurance

After you have collected all the required documents, you can submit your application to the Tunisian Embassy or Consulate in your country. You can do this either in person or by mail, depending on the procedures in your country.

You will also need to pay the visa fee when you submit your application. The fee will depend on the type of visa you are applying for and the duration of your stay in Tunisia
